Bermudian Landing Baptist Church History: Memories of Friends from the Church, School, and Community is an illustrated book with a story for young and old. Sixty years of adventure with captioned photographs fill its pages. We see a community of Christians wholeheartedly living for the Lord Jesus Christ in the River Valley Region of Belize. We observe how village Christians pooled limited personal resources for maximum community benefit. The solidarity of these church members, combined with their desire to nurture others with kindness, helped the River Valley Region transition well from colony to nationhood in 1981. Organizational rules and practices in their churches also helped prepare them for leadership responsibilities in their communities, work places, and government. Appendices I, II, and III reveal that Baptists sought and still seek to structure their lives in community on Biblical principles. In 1822 when Baptists first arrived in the colony that became British Honduras/Belize, they were convinced that Galatians 3:26-29 meant that everyone was to be included in joint worship. Whether slave or free, whether black, white, or brown, whether their origin was African, Creole, European, Garifuna, Hispanic, Mayan, or East Indian, all were welcome and invited to share the good news of salvation and wholeness in Christ to everyone. Appendix IV encourages the readers to add their faith stories that happened in relation to Bermudian Landing and its Baptist church. The authors hope that the book will stimulate others to write the histories of their churches.

He has been a mission pastor of Grand Ave Baptist Church in Fort Smith, Arkansas; Vietnamese Hope Baptist Church in Alexandria, Virginia; Vietnamese United Baptist Church in Austin, Texas; First Baptist Church of Pensacola, Florida; Vietnamese Gospel Baptist Church in Orlando, Florida; and Vietnamese Gospel Baptist Church of Alexandria, Virginia (from 1987 to 1995 and 2010 to the present). He was an adjunct professor of the Boyce Bible College of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary Extension and the John Leland Center for Theological Studies in Arlington, Virginia, and was vice president of the Vietnamese Baptist Theological School in Dallas, Texas. He has been a speaker at Vietnamese National Church conferences in the United States, Canada, Europe, and Australia, as well as a speaker for the Alpha and Omega Program at Vietnam Public Radio in Washington, DC.
