This is the only book to date offering a critical overview of Shinto from early times to the modern era, and evaluating Shinto's place in Japanese religious culture. In recent years, a few books on medieval Shinto have appeared, but none has attempted to depict the broader picture, to examine critically Shinto's origins and its subsequent development through the medieval, pre-modern and modern periods. The essays in this book address such key topics as Shinto and Daoism in early Japan, Shinto and the natural environment, Shinto and state ritual in early Japan, Shinto and Buddhism in medieval Japan, and Shinto and the state in the modern period. All of the essays highlight the dynamic nature of Shinto and shrine history by focusing on the three-way relationship, often fraught, between local shrine cults, Shinto agendas and Buddhism.

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Un'opera fondamentale dedicata allo studio della lingua cinese colta risalente al periodo fondativo della cultura cinese (VI-II sec. a.C.) e imprescindibile per conoscere una tra le più importanti civiltà millenarie. Composta da un corpus di opere ampio e complesso, la lingua cinese classica ha fornito le basi identitarie linguistiche e ideologiche di quelle che sarebbero diventate la "Cina" e la "cultura tradizionale cinese". Per la prima volta in Occidente i testi presi in considerazione comprendono, oltre alle opere a stampa tramandate da una tradizione di alcuni secoli posteriore, i manoscritti su bambù e su seta rinvenuti di recente nelle tombe del IV-I secolo a.C., manoscritti che hanno cambiato la comprensione della lingua, della scrittura, della storia e del pensiero filosofico, religioso e scientifico della Cina antica, fonti epigrafiche oggi imprescindibili per studiare la civiltà cinese.

The volume studies the mechanisms of diachronic change in sentence structure between classical Latin and early Romance languages. For this purpose it draws on the theoretical insights of Generative Grammar. Special reference is made to two of the aspects in which this change reveals itself most clearly: the order of the major constituents in the sentence and the syntax of weak and clitic pronominal forms. These two syntactic phenomena are then used as fundamental criteria for the reconstruction of sentence structure in the various stages of linguistic evolution.

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This book introduces the major works and debates in Chinese children's literature within the framework of China's revolution and modernization. It demonstrates that the guiding rationale in children's literature was the political importance of children as the nation's future. This illustrated edition of Chengyu: 100 Common Chinese Idioms features over one hundred of the most common and useful Chinese idioms in use today. The idioms include illustrations, pinyin pronunciation and stories. Chinese idioms are four characters long, and have a rich history in classical Chinese. La Grammatica d'uso della lingua cinese, pensata per lo studio autonomo o come supporto al libro di testo in aula, è rivolta a studenti di livello 14 della certificazione HSK (Hanyu Shuiping Kaoshi), corrispondente ai livelli A1B1 del Quadro Comune Europeo di Riferimento per le Lingue. Il testo è articolato in 75 unità su doppia pagina: la pagina di sinistra presenta i contenuti teorici attraverso brevi spiegazioni, tabelle

esplicative e numerosi esempi (in caratteri, trascrizione pinyin e traduzione), mentre la pagina di destra propone i relativi esercizi. Le unità sono ordinate per argomento grammaticale: in particolare, prima vengono le principali parti del discorso, poi i costituenti sintattici e infine alcune costruzioni. Le ultime cinque unità sono relative alle funzioni comunicative di base. Nello studio del testo è possibile seguire la progressione presentata esaurendo un argomento alla volta oppure costruire un percorso autonomo in base alle esigenze individuali di apprendimento. Gli esercizi proposti appartengono a diverse tipologie e mirano allo sviluppo di varie abilità: oltre a quelli che verificano la conoscenza grammaticale, sono presenti esercizi relativi all'abilità di lettura e scrittura, nonché di traduzione. Ogni dieci unità gli esercizi di riepilogo consentono di verificare i progressi raggiunti; due esercitazioni di riepilogo generale chiudono infine il volume. L'appendice include materiali utili per la consultazione del dizionario (tavola dei radicali), per l'approfondimento di singole parti del discorso (classificatori, verbi separabili) e per la scrittura (punteggiatura). Completano il testo: le soluzioni di tutti gli esercizi e un indice analitico essenziale.

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
