La littérature haïtienne occupe une grande place sur la scène internationale. Les auteurs haïtiens sont lus sur tous les continents. Ils participent à des rencontres en Martinique, à Paris et à New York. En même temps, Haïti accueille de plus en plus d'écrivains étrangers ainsi que des manifestations littéraires. Mais, en règle générale, ces activités littéraires impliquent toujours la même poignée d'auteurs publiant principalement à l'étranger. De retour en Haïti après ses études aux Etats-Unis, Nadève Ménard se rend compte que ses étudiants lisent surtout les écrivains vivant et publiant principalement en Haïti. Entre les deux littératures, la différence n'est pas seulement au niveau des auteurs et des livres considérés, mais aussi des thèmes. La critique étrangère considère l'exil comme le thème dominant la littérature haïtienne, alors qu'en Haïti même, ce sont des thèmes universels qui sont évoqués et discutés, comme la violence, l'amour, la sexualité, la ville... C'est cette littérature que le présent ouvrage expose dans sa diversité, en s'arrêtant sur les années 1986 à 2006, la première date ayant représenté un tournant majeur dans la société haïtienne. L'objectif de ce livre est ainsi de donner une large perspective de la littérature haïtienne contemporaine et d'y inclure autant d'écrivains que possible. Même après le séisme du 12 janvier 2010, la littérature haïtienne, comme le pays, continue de vivre.

'Rewriting' in the context of critical work on Caribbean literature has tended to be used to discuss revisionism from a variety of postcolonial perspectives, such as 'rewriting history' or 'rewriting canonical texts.' By shifting the focus to how Caribbean writers return to their own works in order to rework them, this book offers theoretical considerations to postcolonial studies on 'literariness' in relation to the near-obsessive degree of rewriting to which Caribbean writers have subjected their own literary texts. Focusing specifically on FrankZtienne, this book offers an overview of how the defining aesthetic and thematic components of FrankZtienne's major works have emerged over the course of his forty-year writing career. It reveals the marked development of key notions guiding his literary creation since the 1960s, and demonstrates that rewriting illustrates the central aesthetic of the Spiral which has always shaped his work. It is, the book argues, the constantly moving form of the Spiral which FrankZtienne explores through his constant reworking of his previously written texts. FrankZtienne and Rewriting negotiates between the literary and material ends of the burgeoning field of postcolonial studies, arguing that literary characteristics in FrankZtienne connect with changing political, social, economic, and cultural circumstances in the Haiti he rewrites.

Published in 1884 when the controversial general's popularity was at its height, these letters offer an insight into his personality.

Le Togo est l'un des plus petits pays de l'Afrique de l'Ouest. Il a cependant l'avantage d'être un Etat côtier, avec seulement cinquante kilomètres de côte, mais disposant d'une longueur appréciable d'environ 700 km. Ainsi avec ses 56 600 km<sup>2</sup> de superficie, il partage environ 1 500 km de frontière avec ses voisins. Cette configuration géographique en fait un espace privilégié dans la sous-région, en dépit de l'étroitesse de sa superficie. Il est donc prédisposé à jouer un important rôle dans l'intégration régionale. Cette vocation de pays de transit fut très vite comprise par les autorités coloniales et les dirigeants du Togo indépendant. Elle se traduit dans les pratiques économiques et sociales de nombreux acteurs, faisant ainsi du Togo, un pays largement ouvert aux populations de la sous-région et donc un des champions de l'intégration régionale en Afrique de l'Ouest. La re-visitation de l'histoire lointaine et proche de cet espace, qui est ici faite, montre les atouts, les résistances et formes d'adhésion des populations à cette propension naturelle à l'intégration du territoire du Togo à la région Afrique de l'Ouest. Le présent ouvrage est basé sur les contributions fournies dans le cadre du séminaire national organisé à Lomé, les 22 et 23 avril 2006.
